Tiffany Atkinson knows that a home is much more than four walls—it is a place where love, security, and hope can grow.

A lifelong Northshore resident, Tiffany works as an Administrative Assistant for Atmosphere Movers, a company she proudly calls “the absolute best moving company in Louisiana.” As a devoted single mother, she balances a full-time work schedule with raising her energetic daughter, Olivia, who turns five this August. Despite working 45 hours each week, Tiffany dedicates every Saturday to completing her Habitat for Humanity sweat equity, while Sundays are reserved for “girls’ day”—special adventures with Olivia, whether relaxing at Land O’ Pines, swimming, or spending time by the river.

For several years, Tiffany and Olivia have shared a bedroom in her elderly mother’s home, where Tiffany moved in to help with household expenses. Unfortunately, the home has fallen into significant disrepair. Frequent flooding, mold, and limited space have made daily life challenging, while Tiffany also works to help her mother transition into affordable housing and eventually assisted living.

Through Habitat for Humanity, Tiffany sees the opportunity to create lasting stability for her family. “Having a place that is home and is mine,” she says, “somewhere Olivia can always call home and know she is safe and loved,” is what excites her most. Olivia, meanwhile, can’t wait to have a room of her own—decorated in her favorite Barbie theme.



Habitat’s homeownership program has also strengthened Tiffany’s financial confidence. She has learned valuable budgeting and saving skills and plans to continue building toward her next goal: purchasing a dependable vehicle. “Smart spending equals better savings,” she says. “Having a clear goal makes it so much easier to save.”

Above all, Tiffany wants others to know how deeply grateful she is for this opportunity. She hopes to give Olivia a future built on stability, encouragement, and unconditional love. One message she reminds her daughter of every day is simple but powerful: “You can tell me anything, and I will always believe in you.”
